



Ribbon Neck-let and Bracelet

Each pack of Selection beads has an assortment of beads of varying shapes, sizes and colours which work well together. Choose beads from your mix to create a design that appeals to you. Refer to the photograph for suggestions

You will be working from the centre of the necklace out towards the back fastening. There will be a centre bead grouping with smaller bead groupings on either side. The width of the ribbon holds beads in place with or without knots.

You will need...

- Selections (4688)
- 6mm sheer ribbon
- Scissors

Step-by-step for neck-let

1-Thread on your chosen beads and place in the centre of a 1 metre length of ribbon (less if you don't tie knots between bead groupings) – this forms the central bead grouping. You can tie a knot to hold beads in place if you like, but the width of the ribbon will hold beads in place as shown in our sample.

2-Continue to add groupings of beads on both sides until the necklace is the preferred length.

3-Hold up to your neck to determine where you would like the bead fastening to be placed (usually the centre of the back of the neck).

4-To make a bead fastening, thread a single bead onto one end of the ribbon at the point where you would like it to fasten. Fold the remaining ribbon over the bead, leave a little slack and tie a single, overhand knot just under the bead, using both strands of ribbon.

5-To make the loop for the other side of the bead fastening, form a loop large enough to go over the bead in Step 4, from the ribbon at the opposite end of the necklace. Hold it up by the bead end and this loop and adjust to ensure the loop fastening is positioned equal distance from the last bead grouping. Tie an overhand knot at the base of the loop using both strands of ribbon.



Step-by-step for bracelet

Follow the same technique instructions for a bracelet using 40-50cm of ribbon.
